



Electronics Release Plan

- Store Electronics on an impervious surface and within a structure or unit such that the electronics are protected from precipitation;
- Package electronic devices in a manner adequate to prevent breakage during transportation, storage and handling;
- Clean up broken and damaged electronic devices immediately. All clean up materials and debris contained and labeled as “broken electronic devices”;
- Broken CRT’s shall be placed in a structurally sound container and labeled as “Universal Waste Cathode Ray Tubes”, “Used Cathode Ray Tubes”, “Universal Waste CRT’s”, or “Used CRT’s”;
- Broken electronic devices that contain mercury lamps (LCD Devices) must be cleaned up immediately and placed in a closed plastic container that is structurally sound. Label the container as “broken electronic devices”;
- Locations must not accumulate electronic devices for longer than one year from the date the electronic device is delivered to the facility;
- Containers used to store broken devices can be shipped to a recycling facility along with other containers of intact devices.
